

Adorable Kittens and Cats: A Lesson to Help Your Child Learn Sight Words

- Be patient. It takes time for children to learn sight words. Don't get discouraged if your child doesn't learn all of the words right away.
- Practice regularly. The more your child practices, the better they will become at recognizing sight words.


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
