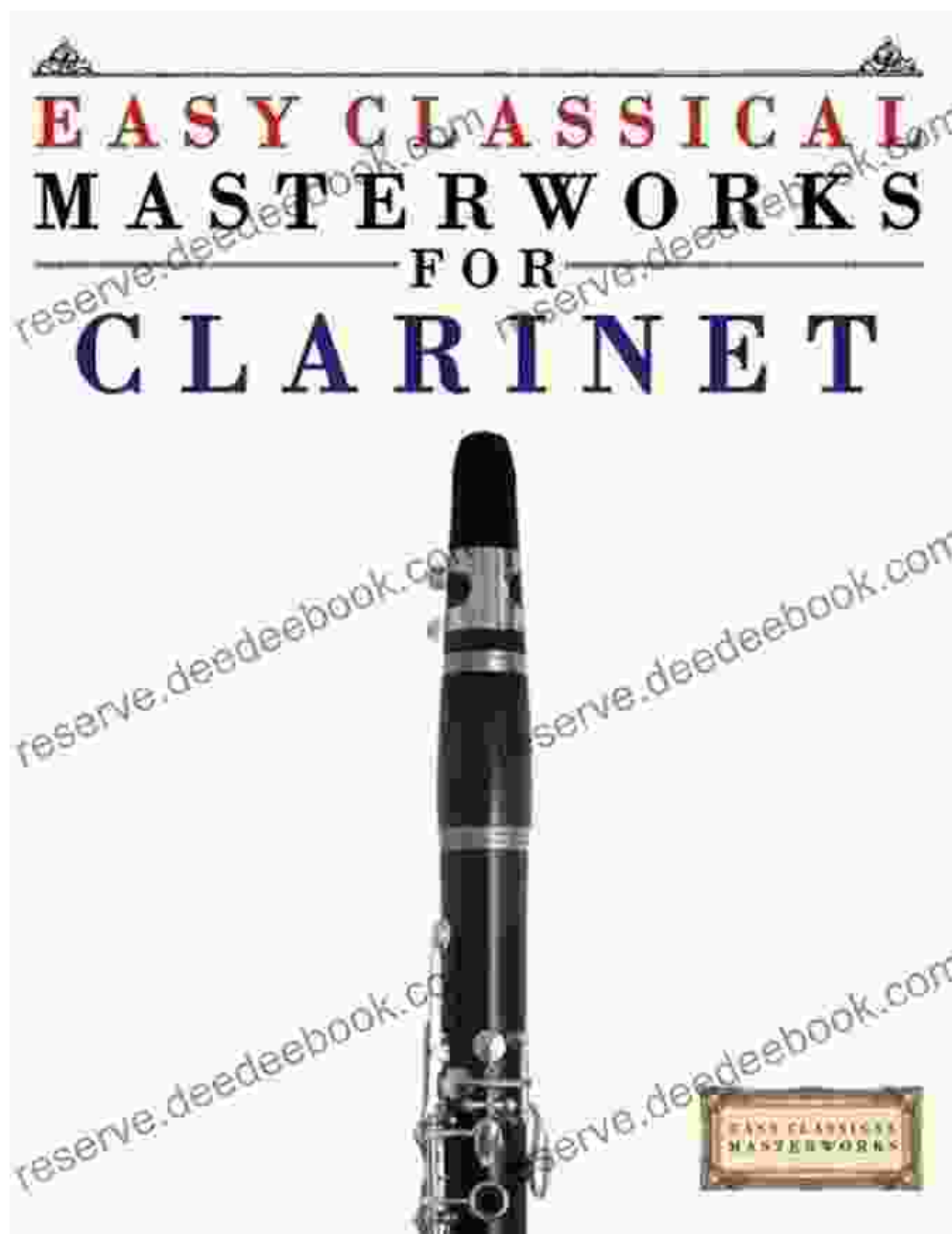
Johannes Brahms (1833-1897)

Franz Schubert (1797-1828)

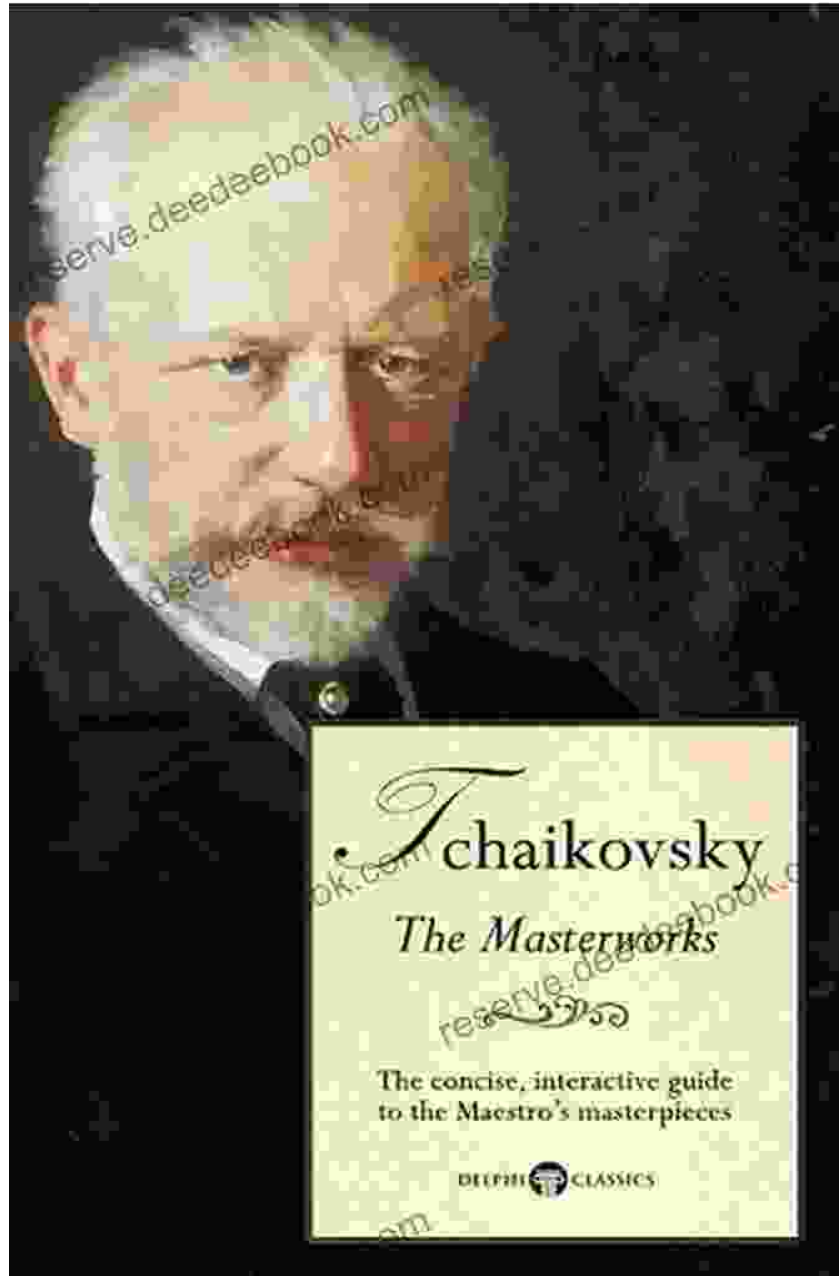
